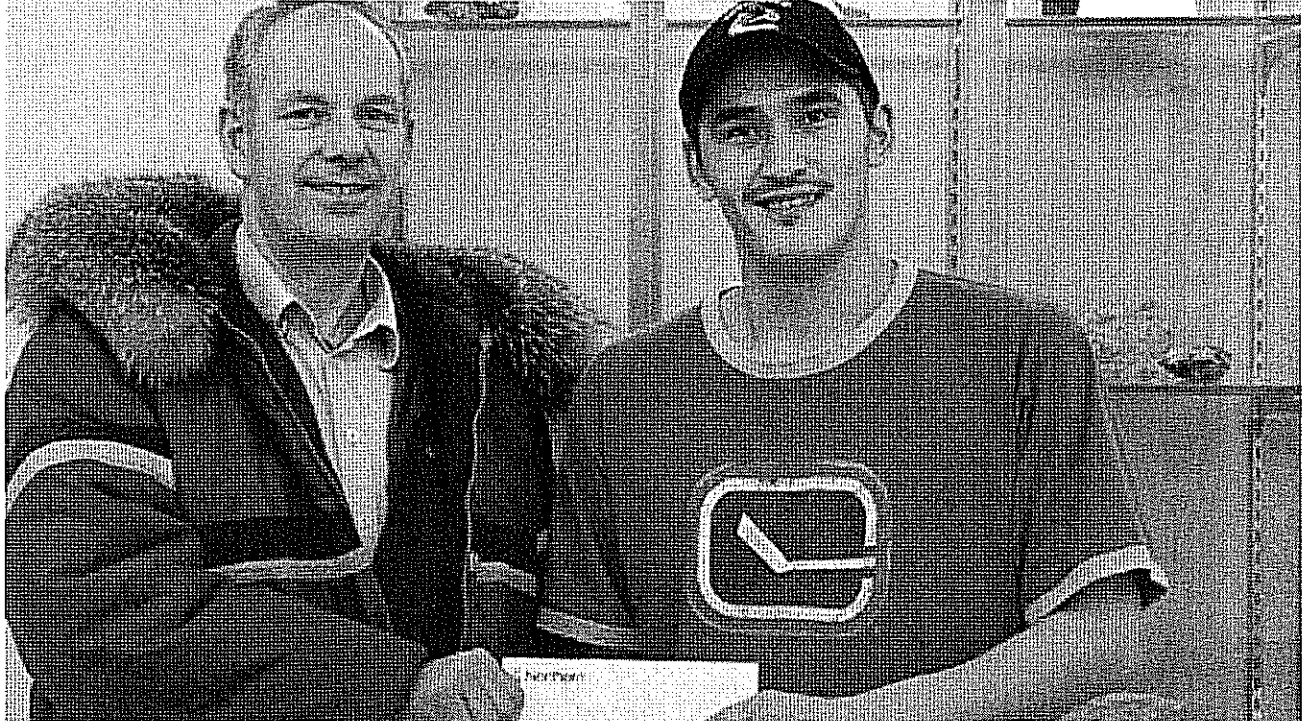


Environmental Technology student awarded NorthMart ETP scholarship!
