

Teaming Up With NHL Pro to Stop Bullying

The North West Company teams up with NHL star Eric Fehr and raises \$5000 to support the Canadian Red Cross bullying prevention programs.

Winnipeg, September 3, 2015 - The North West Company (NWC) and NHL star Eric Fehr teamed up once again to present a \$5000 donation to the Canadian Red Cross to support their bullying prevention programs.

In late 2014, Eric Fehr, former Winnipeg Jet, partnered with NWC to help raise money and awareness for bullying prevention programs through the sale of the book - The Bulliest Dozer – which he co-authored.

The Bulliest Dozer, a children's book which teaches a very important anti-bullying message and encourages positive behaviour, hit the shelves of Manitoba Giant Tiger stores late 2014. The book cost \$10 with 100% of the proceeds benefiting the Canadian Red Cross and their bullying prevention school programs.

"I hope The Bulliest Dozer can be a fun way to discuss a serious topic. I think it's important for kids to understand how damaging bullying can be, and how they can help put a stop to it." said Eric Fehr.

The book generated \$5000 in sales, which The North West Company and Giant Tiger presented to the Canadian Red Cross alongside Eric. An additional \$10,000 was personally donated by Eric to the Canadian Red Cross.
