Northern Youth Running and Raising Support for Healthy Horizons Foundation at Manitoba Marathon

Winnipeg MB, June 16, 2017— This Sunday, June 18, thousands of Manitobans will lace up for the 2017 Manitoba Marathon. Among them will be a group of 17 students, with ages ranging from 10 to 17 years old from three northern Manitoba First Nation communities whose journey towards healthy living will culminate as they enter Investors Group Field and cross the finish line.

Over the past several months youth runners from the Chief Sam Cook School in Tataskweyak Cree Nation (Split Lake), MB, Otter Nelson River School in Pimicikamak Cree Nation (Cross Lake), MB and Poplar River Elementary School in Poplar River First Nation, MB have been training for the 10K run, while raising funds for the Healthy Horizons Foundation.

"We have been promoting healthy living fundraiser runs for over 12 years. We know that setting goals to complete a long distance run and raise funds for a charity requires dedication, fosters resilience, and strengthens the sense of community," said Craig Gilpin, Executive Vice-President and Chief Operating Officer, The North West Company

"The initial focus of Healthy Horizons is to support communities in northern Canada where we operate Northern and NorthMart stores. All of the funds raised for Healthy Horizons will be reinvested directly into youth community programing." added Gilpin.

To ensure all of the funds raised are directed back into northern communities, North West donates administrative and travel costs associated with the weekend event.
